Accessing and Viewing JULIE's Ticket Entry Webpage



JULIE's web-based Remote Ticket Entry webpage can be accessed by Illinois excavators at:

(Note the underscore character "_" between julie_ticketentry.html)

Once accessed, users will be prompted for their unique login account information.

After successfully logging in, users will see the Ticket Entry page into which information about their pending excavation is to be entered. JULIE operators currently use 24" monitors set to a video resolution of 1920 by 1080. Users who are unable to view the entire entry screen might consider either adjusting their video resolution OR temporarily decreasing the size of the Ticket Entry view by typing "Control -". The "Control -" will reduce the size of the entry screen, which may allow it to then fit on the user's viewable area. Alternatively, a "Control+" will increase the size of the displayed window.

Another useful browser view manipulation tool is toggling back and forth from Full Screen view to Normal view via the F11 key. Typing the F11 will alternate between Full Screen view and Normal view. These views are user optional based on personal preference.
