JULIE OFFERS NEW ONLINE TRAINING

Our <u>Damage Prevention Managers</u> can answer your questions about the safe digging process, assist with the planning of projects and mediate discussions to help you and your crew avoid potential injuries and costly delays. They can also talk to your employees at job site tailgate or toolbox talks meetings and <u>safety trainings</u>. Regardless of when a project starts, JULIE wants to remind anyone digging of a few very important steps to take before digging in:

- <u>Always pre-mark</u> your proposed excavation route or site. By pre-marking the area of excavation, you can help clarify the information on the locate request, allow your crew to visually verify the dig area when they arrive at the site and compare that information with the locate request. <u>Click here for recommended guidelines</u>.
- Provide adequate time to have underground utility lines located and marked Contact JULIE at least 2 business days before starting your project. Do not simply default to the minimum 2 working days advance notice if not needed. If your proposed excavation project requires multiple locate requests, stagger the dig start dates and times or stagger the dates the tickets are called in or submitted online. Submitting multiple tickets all with the minimum 48-hour advance notice places an undue burden on the utility locate staff. Enter an online request now.
- Never use mechanized equipment near buried utilities or pipelines carefully hand dig within 18 inches on either side of the marked approximate location of the buried underground

facilities. Learn more about the tolerance zone.

BE PREPARED

Our call center is staffed with agents to receive and process locate requests, but longer-than-usual hold times may occur, especially during peak times. If you still choose to call in a locate request, it is important to be prepared with the proper information and remember that we are always open, day or night. Contractors can avoid potential delays in the center by using our <u>online E-Request entry page</u> anytime to submit a locate request with no training required.

Utility members are required to respond to all locate requests received within the time explicitly specified by <u>state law</u>. We encourage you to only submit tickets that you fully intend to excavate on within the next 2-14 days. Additionally, please confirm that ALL member utilities listed on your locate requests have been marked before beginning excavation. <u>Click here for information about the Illinois</u> <u>Commerce Commission's enforcement process</u>.

Another popular self-service option is <u>Remote Ticket Entry (RTE)</u>.
