

Reclaimed water, irrigation



PROTECT CRITICAL SERVICES

Hitting a pipeline or underground utility line can impact your farm and family for generations. But you can help prevent damage from occurring simply by contacting JULIE before you dig at least 3 days before starting a project. The process is easy.

1: Identify Your Dig Area

Pre-mark the dig site with white paint, flags or stakes.

2: Submit A Locate Request

3: Wait For The Paint Or Flags

Utility companies are required to mark their underground lines by the date and time on the locate request. Remember, a minimum of 3 days' advance notice is required.

4: Respect The Marks

Don't remove flags, stakes or paint marks until your project is finished.

5: Dig With Care

Understand the tolerance zone.

Never rely on permanent markers or assume you know the location or depth of underground utilities buried on your property. Lines that carry natural gas, oil, electricity, fiber optics, communications, and water may be just a few inches below ground because of topsoil removal, erosion and weather.

It takes everyone—property owners, tenant farmers, farmers, utility owners and operators, utility locators, design professionals, excavators, and contractors—to ensure the safety of those who work and live in the agricultural community. Do your part to protect Illinois farms, families and the environment.
